### June Bus Trip to Yew Dell Botanical Gardens and Hidden Hill Nursery

On June 7<sup>th</sup>, Hendricks County Master Gardeners enjoyed a bus trip to Yew Dell Botanical Gardens and Hidden Hill Nursery. Each attendee was eligible for 6 hours of education credit for attending.

The following excerpt of the history of the garden is taken from the Yew Dell website:

"Beginning with 33-acres of Oldham County farmland in 1941, Theodore and Martha Lee Klein spent the next 60-plus years developing an exquisite private estate, a successful commercial nursery and an extensive collection of unusual plants and outstanding gardens. Known locally, nationally and internationally as a first-rate plantsman, Theodore Klein was also a self-taught artisan who personally crafted the buildings and gardens that became known as Yew Dell."

Attendees saw many of the Theodore Klein's original plantings in the arboretum – 40 foot tall weeping pines and cypress, 20 foot tall hollies of many cultivars, a magnolia with blooms as large as a basketball, and so many other varieties of trees that were very mature and stately. It was a wonderful display! The structures referred to in the paragraph above included a castle (to serve as a meeting place), a magnificent barn with a basement, a log cabin, the original family home, and a grafting building. According to his son, Jules, who some of us were lucky enough to have as a tour guide, Mr. Klein never laid off his seasonal workers. Instead, he created building projects to keep his staff employed year round.

The original greenhouse has been replaced with a larger greenhouse with a green roof. Yes, the backside of the roof was completely covered in succulents! What a wonderful legacy this family has created and now it is shared with the public by the generosity of community, members, volunteers, and The Garden Conservancy.

At Hidden Hill Nursery, Bob Hill, owner of the nursery and gardens, was the tour guide. Bob took the group through many of the "rooms" he has created with unusual trees, shrubs, perennials, and totally unique garden art. One of the rooms was the understory of a tree that wept to the ground. Another was the "stacked stone" room, where visitors could stack stones in any design, then knock them down and do it all over again. Bob's sense of humor could be seen throughout the gardens with many whimsical displays of sculpture made from found objects.

The group found the plant selection in the nursery very enticing and kept the cashier very busy. The storage compartment of the bus was nearly full on the return trip. Everyone was enjoying the shopping and the fellowship in the shade area so much so that our departure time was upon us before we knew it.

During the ride home, some discussion started brewing about *the next HCMG trip.* Stay tuned for more to come on that topic!
