HCMG Receives 2nd Place Award in Search for Excellence at the State Conference

Hendricks County Master Gardener, Inc. was recognized for the garden education project at the Plainfield Correctional Facility at the 2014 Purdue Master Gardener State Conference in the Search for Excellence, receiving a second place award.

The Plainfield Correctional Facility (PCF) is a medium security adult male facility. Volunteers from Hendricks County Master Gardeners, PCF officers, offenders and staff members, joined to participate in this new gardening venture. Hendricks County Master Gardeners assisted PCF staff by working with offenders and staff to teach them proper gardening techniques while establishing gardens on facility grounds.

During growing season from May 2013 - October 2013 (20 weeks) approximately 20 offenders worked daily on the following tasks: planting, watering, weeding, Insect/disease management, Compost fertilizing, Harvesting and packaging. PCF offenders contributed 14,000 hours while participating in the project and Hendricks County Master Gardeners contributed 410 hours training offenders and staff about gardening and assisting with the maintenance of the gardens.

Barb Zupan showed off plants in sun, shade, bog, and free day lilies, plus a little quiz regarding poison ivy and something else.

Mike and Vicki Kidwell's gardens offered perennials in brilliant abundance. When they told us their plant sources, would you believe it was garden club auctions and the MG auction! With all the waves of color, there was a wonderful espalier with "bouqueted" clusters of pears.

Sharon Miller's gardens showed a backdrop of nature that held our attention with awe, including a tree line that was stunning. Besides perennials that she keeps moving to meet her artist needs, there is a pin oak that had lost its leader and upper 1/3 of the tree, but with care and hope has completely recovered.

On the other side of gardening are vegetables! Kelly Allen's Plainfield vegetable garden and roadside stand is ALL that - vegetables galore. She has hand dug and hand washed over 1,400 pounds of potatoes this year, which is part of what is available. This garden is at its peak and if you do want to see it, give Kelly a call.
