

Jon Cain Retires After 26 Years with Purdue Extension

Jon Cain started his career as a vocational agriculture teacher in Wabash County, followed by time working for the USDA, Indiana University- Purdue University at Indianapolis (IUPUI), and Indiana University-Kokomo (IUK). At IUPUI and at IUK, Jon worked in continuing education programs, off-campus programs, scholarship, and career development.

Jon came to Purdue Extension as the Brown County Extension Educator and Ag/Natural Resources (ANR), where he served for 8 years and then moved to Bartholomew County for 3 years. In both counties, Jon started the Master Gardener programs. He completed his service as Extension Educator and ANR, with 15 years in Hendricks County.

Jon contributed to the Master Gardener (MG) program statewide by serving on the Purdue MG Leadership Issue Based Action Team (IBAT) Advisory Team formed to develop and launch Purdue Master Gardeners...Growing Through Leadership.

During the August 14 meeting, the Hendricks County Master Gardeners received a visit from John Orick who helped formally thank Jon Cain, Purdue Extension Educator and Master Gardener (MG) Coordinator Hendricks County, for 26 years of service. Jon's last day was August 29.

HCMG wishes Jon the best in his retirement and would like to once again thank him for his service to Purdue Extension and 15 great years in Hendricks County!
