YES, there will be a meeting **June 16th**. This meeting was not included in the handbook. It is a bonus meeting because we usually don't have a meeting during the month when we have a bus trip scheduled.

Please note the schedule for the evening. Yoga for Gardeners will begin at 7:00pm. We will have a short break with snacks, followed by the business meeting at approximately 8:00pm. Due to limited space, this is a members only class.

The Yoga for Gardeners class will help you learn simple yoga poses that you can use to relieve the stresses on your body that gardening may cause. The class will be gentle on our garden weary bodies and help us prepare for the busy summer ahead. Bending forward to pull weeds or plant can strain the lower back, hips, neck and shoulders so we will be practicing poses to relieve tightness in those areas. No previous yoga experience is necessary. Crystal Crews has been teaching yoga in Hendricks County for 12 years and is an avid gardener who took the MG class in 1999.

No mats are required. We will not be lying on the floor. We will be working from standing and seated positions, using chairs. Be sure to wear comfortable clothes and rubber soled shoes, so you can move easily and safely. It is advisable that you don't eat heavily for an hour to two before a yoga class.

New Purdue Master Gardener Program Policy- Your Action Required!

There is a new Purdue Master Gardener Program Policy that took effect on September 15, 2014. Purdue has asked that we integrate all Master Gardeners into the new policy by September 2015. As you know, we have been without a Master Gardener Coordinator as the Ag/Natural Resources Extension Educator position has been vacant until recently. That means, we now only have a few short months to get everyone integrated into the new policy. **This means all Master Gardeners who wish to remain active must take action before September 1, 2015!**

What is required by Purdue Master Gardener volunteers?

All **current and new** Master Gardeners must:

Read the MG Program Policy Guide (MG-5-W). This can be downloaded for free from Purdue's Education Store at: https://mdc.itap.purdue.edu/item.asp?item_number=MG-5-W#.VWhyN2NgSVo

Return completed and signed Purdue MG Volunteer Application and Agreement form to Angie Tilton (annually)

Provide evidence of government-issued photo ID (one time requirement)

Purdue Extension office staff will complete sex and violent offender registry checks (annually)

Report volunteer activity and educational training hours to Angie Tilton for approval (annually)

Why did we need an updated policy? The update brings the program into compliance with Purdue's interim volunteer policy. The new policy defines relationships and roles for volunteers and Purdue. It also provides clarification of administrative policies for the program and brings consistency to the administration of the program.

Upcoming presentation on the new policy:

There will be a brief presentation at the MG meeting on Tuesday, June 16th following yoga. I will have hard copies of the new program policy to distribute, as well as Volunteer Application and Agreement forms. Purdue Extension office staff will also be on hand to collect signed forms and verify state issued photos IDs. We will also be available during the MG picnic on July 21st to check photo IDs and collect completed forms. MG can also stop by the Purdue Extension- Hendricks County office any time Monday - Friday, 8 am - 4 pm before September 1, 2015 to return signed and completed forms and to have their photo IDs checked. Again, **all MG's must return a signed and completed Volunteer Application and Agreement form and provide evidence of a government-issued photo ID by September 1, 2015.**
