The Scholarship Committee is pleased to announce the recipient of the \$1,500 HCMG Scholarship for the 2014-15 academic year is Leah Marie Jones.

Ms. Jones is a senior at Danville High School, currently ranked 27 out of a class of 198 graduating seniors. She plans to attend Purdue University this fall where she will be majoring in Agribusiness in the College of Agriculture at Purdue West Lafayette.

Ms. Jones was an excellent candidate with many accomplishments, including 2 years on the National Honor Society, 4 years of service on the Danville High School student council, 3 years as part of Danville FFA, and representing the State of Indiana at the National FFA Leadership Conference in 2013. In 2012, she received second place in the State Horticulture Science and Management Leadership competition and first place in the district. She has also been awarded multiple blue ribbons and honors by Hendricks County 4-H, which she has been participating in for 10 years.
