Tomato Grafting Workshop at Southwest Purdue Agricultural Center (SWPAC)(Vincennes)

Grafting has the potential to control soilborne diseases and increase yield of high tunnel grown tomatoes. To help tomato growers learn grafting technology, we plan to organize tomato grafting workshops at SWPAC this fall. The workshops will be conducted on Nov. 14, 16, 17, from 2:00 pm to 3:00 pm (EST).
